CALL FOR PAPERS

The **Eastern African Journal of Hospitality, Leisure and Tourism** (ISSN NO: 1821-8393) is a peer reviewed online international journal in areas of sustainable tourism, hospitality and leisure. This journal publishes high-quality articles, reviews, abridged version of research twice every year. The journal welcomes contributions that are relevant to the developmental goals in the dynamic disposition of tourism-based economies in and outside East Africa.

The main theme for the thirty-first issue is “**Global crises and tourism: *An assessment of a rapidly changing global scenario.***” The sub-themes are: -

- Economic crises and tourism

- Policy failure in tourism
- Food security and bioregionalism
- Tourism and mass displacement
- Humanitarian disasters and tourism
- Tourism and disaster capitalism

Preparation of Manuscript:

Each manuscript should include a separate title page, which indicates title of the paper, author(s) name(s) and titles (e.g. Dr., Miss, Professor), institutional affiliations, complete mailing address(es), e-mail address(es) and phone, and name of author to whom all correspondence should be addressed. The next page should have the research title, abstract (maximum of 250 words) and a maximum of 6 keywords. Abstracts should be most informative, giving a clear indication of the nature and range of results in the paper, text should be single-spaced, 12 font size, Times New Roman font style. The manuscript should include the following sections: Introduction, Literature Review, Methodology, Findings and Conclusion.

Tables/figures/graphs should be typed as close as possible to the location where they are cited. Headings should be centered for each figure/ graph and should be 12 font size, bold face and all caps. Equations should be placed on separate lines and numbered consecutively, with the equation numbers placed within parentheses and aligned against the left margin. Authors should retain a copy of their manuscript since we cannot accept responsibility for damage or loss of papers. Original manuscripts would be discarded one month after publication unless the publisher is asked to return original material after use.

The standard of the manuscript:

The author should follow this order when typing manuscripts: Title, Authors, Affiliations, Abstract, Keywords, Main text, Acknowledgements, Appendix, References, and then Tables. A brief biography will be required for the purpose of publishing. Therefore, it should also be supplied on a separate manuscript page as should the Title, Author/s and Affiliations to facilitate blind refereeing. The Concise Oxford English Dictionary will be used as a reference for all spellings and hyphenations. Statistics should be given in figures, e.g. 10 minutes, 40 meters, except where the number begins a sentence. When the number does not refer to a unit of measurement it is spelt out in full, e.g. ten guests, except where the number is more than one hundred, e.g. 225 bedrooms. Abbreviations should not be used except for SI units, e.g. kg (kilogram).

References:

All publications cited in the text should be present in a list of references following the text of the manuscript. The list of references should be arranged alphabetically by authors' names. The manuscript should be carefully checked to ensure that the spelling of authors' names and dates are exactly the same in the text as in the reference list. All reference must be done in APA reference style (6th edition).

Illustrations:

All illustrations should be provided in camera-ready form, suitable for reproduction. Photographs, charts and diagrams are all to be referred to as "Figure(s)" and should be numbered consecutively in the order to which they are referred. All illustrations should be clearly marked on the back with the figure number and the author's name. All figures must have a caption.

Photographs:

Original photographs must be supplied as they are to be reproduced (e.g. black and white photocopies of photographs are not acceptable).

Tables: Tables should be as few as possible and include only essential data. Tables should be numbered consecutively and given a suitable caption and each table typed on a separate sheet.

Submission of Papers

Manuscripts from authors should be in MS-word format and send your manuscripts to : tourism@saut.ac.tz. Submission of a paper implies that it has not been published previously, that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, and that if accepted it will not be published elsewhere in the same form, in English or in any other language, without the written consent of the publisher.

The **Eastern African Journal of Hospitality, Leisure and Tourism** is therefore inviting papers for **Volume 8 Number 1**. The last date for submission of the manuscript is **28th February 2021**. However, the early submitted manuscripts will get preference in case of reviews and publication process.
